Membership on the board shall be statewide and shall consist of two (2) parents of deaf children, one (1) professional in education of the deaf, one (1) former student of the Kentucky School for the Deaf, one (1) member of the Kentucky Association for the Deaf, two (2) members who shall represent school districts, and two (2) members at large. A majority of the board's membership shall be persons who are deaf or hard of hearing.

# T Hulett

- C. New Elementary
  - a. Construction is underway. On schedule within a couple of days, which were given due to weather. Set to be complete in December 2018.
  - b. Project is on budget.
  - c. Foundations footers are in place, with exception of back that has been left open to help mover materials.
  - d. First of June set to put in front trusses.
  - e. Wells for geothermal heat and air will begin soon.
  - f. Upon entrance to new elementary, there will be some art that will "tell the story of KSD."
  - g. Tables in lunch room will have pictures on them to also show KSD's story and future.
  - h. No current access to sight but can see progress from afar. Mr. T is in daily communication with the construction workers and superintendent.
- D. Capital Projects Update
  - a. Project within in Argo (approximately 99% complete):
    - i. New lighting
    - ii. New technology

- iii. New kiln

- vi. New chicken coop; Ag department able to sell eggs
- vii. Will have a new green house
- viii. \$1 million dollars has just been spent on electrical needs like: underground wiring to prevent transformers from blowing. Should last 30-40 years before replacing again. Another part of this is the old mechanical building, Jacobs and Walker. They will be on their own separate meter, which will help protect land around Jacobs. This is in collaboration with KU.
- b. Also working on other projects, lighting is one to increase safety on campus. New lighting could run \$425,000
- c. In the newest budget, KSD was not given extra money for operations. Previously, KSD had been given extra monies. Some of the money KSD splits with KSB.
- d. Working with KDE and energy management in Frankfort. Specifically focusing on heating and air systems in different buildings. Currently, an energy audit will be done on campus to determine where KSD is saving money and where KSD is losing money. This will determine how efficient buildings are. Then changing heating and air systems out. Campus spends \$300,000 on electric and water bills, yearly.

Question: Walker, Barbie, Beachum, Fosdick; what's their future? Will they be used? Answer: Walker is the only one possibly being considered for surplus. They are here if someone wants to use, but no specific plans.

Question: Sidewalks are very small and tight and therefore difficult for deaf to communicate, but if the new ones could be wider, it would be helpful.

Answer: All plans, even sidewalks had to pass ADA.

Question: More explanation on the geothermal system.

Answer: Mr. T gave an explanation. It is a heating and cooling water exchange. More efficient.

Question: Will/when KSD have a new auditorium?

Answer: Auditorium was in the plan 2 years ago. It was part of the original \$30 million (this was split with KSD/KSB, but the full \$30 million was not received, only the normal \$675,000). However, it was not enough, but hasn't left the radar. There is power running to the potential site, but it will have to wait.

Question: Can you replace the air conditioning in the gym?

Answer: Part of the overall plan includes air conditioning, but it will be later.

# **Toyah Robey**

- A. Summer Programs and Events
  - a. FLV June 1-3
    - i. Students will be building blueberries; a computer the size of a credit card
  - b. Summer School/Ag Camp June 10-22
  - c. NEW Gen Cyber Camp July 22-27
    - i. Run by the University of Alabama. 1 of 3 in the nation; Kentucky invited to participate. First in the state. It is for all high school D/HH students in the state. Kentucky students will be chosen first. It is a federal grant, that supports 12 states. The entire camp is paid for. Camp is all about science and technology. Forty kids on computers doing coding. Another event may be at the horse park or Legends game. All staff will be sent for dorms, technology...etc. Also bringing their own equipment. Depending on federal money, it may or may not return. Already using the resource, staff and students went to Alabama for an event. More about the event is on the KSD website.
    - ii. As a result KSD will add 2 robotics classes; 1 in MS and 1 in HS
  - d. Question about the Mini Deaf Olympics being held back in Kentucky; something to keep in mind.

# B. Budget

- a. Historically KSD has been held harmless with the budget. Typically, and short falls the department covered the costs. Through last budget the department was asked to cut \$50 million. KSB/KSD will absorb some of those cuts. In December, budget for KSD went in the hole \$600,000. It was for different reasons: temporary hires in the dorm, retirement pay outs and increasing interpreting costs. Currently still in the hole, \$300,000 in the hole.
- b. KDE gives KSD:
  - i. \$10 million
  - ii. \$9 million is in personnel
  - iii. Toyah provided a graphic and trend line of historical costs
- c. Going forward will need to prioritize
- d. Reviewing which positions are not being utilized
- e. No pink slips given out
- f. May need to reconsider stipends going forward

- a. 13 positions open; principal and KDE admin will determine what won't be refilled

  - b. 8 juniors took ACT; scores not returned
  - c. 2 seniors take ACT and improved overall score and submitted to college of choice

- d. 1 student will be attending EKU, another will be attending a school in Texas
- e. Currently students are in the process of completing KPREP testing, 3<sup>rd</sup> 11<sup>th</sup>
- f. NEW TCT science teachers collecting samples from all grade levels and then submitted to KDE
- g. MAP data K-11<sup>th</sup> take MAP 3 times a year (fall, midyear and April). Growth in all areas this year, except 2<sup>nd</sup> grade reading.

- f. Vision for SLPI going forward. Developing SLP handbook to state procedures. Making contacts with other states who have been using it.
- g. Have a database system set up. This summer plan on setting up a better system that is more organized and will help with budget, planning and scores in one place. Will also try to set up a website for SLPI with all the information about SLPI program: setting up interviews, completing an application, and more technology advanced.
